FAQ's on Fluoride in the Stratford Municipal Water Supply

Is Stratford's Water Safe to Drink? Yes! The notices sent quarterly with the newsletters (and shown below) contain the required wording written by the Iowa Department of Public Health. Community water systems that exceed the fluoride level of 2.0 mg/L (the EPA minimum level) must provide special fluoride public notice to persons served. A recent sample taken from Stratford's water supply contained a fluoride level of 2.47 mg/L.

Does Stratford Add Fluoride to the Drinking Water? No. The fluoride in Stratford's water is naturally occurring. This water supply obtains its water from the limestone and dolomite of the Mississippian Aquifer The aquifer was determined to have low susceptibility to contamination because the characteristics of the aquifer and overlying materials provide natural protection from contaminants at the land surface.

What is an Unsafe Fluoride Level? The maximum level set by the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) is 4.0 mg/L. Drinking water containing more than 4.0 mg/L can increase the risk of certain health issues. Stratford's drinking water does not contain unsafe fluoride levels but Stratford is required to notify persons served when a sample exceeds the 2.0 mg/L minimum.

Fluoride in children's drinking water at levels of approximately 1 mg/L reduces the number of dental cavities. However, some children exposed to levels of fluoride greater than about 2.0 mg/L may develop dental fluorosis. Dental fluorosis, in its moderate and severe forms, is a brown staining or pitting of the permanent teeth, or both.

Because dental fluorosis occurs only when developing teeth (before they erupt from the gums) are exposed to elevated fluoride levels, households without children are not expected to be affected by this level of fluoride.

Families with children under the age of nine are encouraged to seek other sources of drinking water for their children to avoid the possibility of staining and pitting.

Your water supplier can lower the concentration of fluoride in your water so you will still receive the benefits of cavity prevention while the possibility of stained and pitted teeth is minimized. Removal of fluoride may increase your water costs. Treatment systems are also commercially available for home use. Information on such systems is available at the address given by your public water supplier. Low fluoride bottled drinking water that would meet all standards is also commercially available.

For more information, please contact Stratford City Hall Water Department at 515-838-2311. Some home water treatment units are also available to remove fluoride from drinking water. In Iowa, home water treatment units are regulated under 641—Chapter 14, with the water treatment unit registration program administered by the Iowa department of public health's environmental health division. In addition, you may call the National Sanitation Foundation (NSF) International, at 1-877-867-3435. Please share this information with all the other people who drink this water, especially those who may not have received this notice directly (for example, people in apartments, nursing homes, schools, and businesses).

The Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) is designed to assist low-income families with the cost of home heating. Applications are accepted on a first-come / first-serve basis as posted at your local community action office. The Community Action Agency for Stratford is Upper Des Moines Opportunity. A household may qualify for assistance in this program if its' income falls within a prescribed income range. When you apply, bring proof of income for the last 3 months, including verification of any fixed income such as Social Security benefits and Aid to Families with Dependent Children; a copy of your federal income tax return; and copies of your heating and electric bills. WATER RATE INFORMATION

City council passed the first reading of the Ordinance 2020-01 - An Ordinance amending Chapter 92 (Water Rates) at the February 10th 2020 council meeting. The water rate will be increasing three percent. The service for all minimum bills will go from \$16.99 to \$17.50. The gallons used fee will be increasing for the first gallon to 9,999 gallons from \$5.15 to \$5.30 per 1,000 gallons, and from 10,000 gallons to 24, 999 gallons from \$5.40 to 5.56 per 1,000 gallons, and from 25,000 gallons to 39,999 gallons from \$5.66 to \$5.83 per 1000 gallons, and from 40,000 gallons to 99,999 from \$5.92 to \$6.10 per 1,000 gallons, and from 100,000 gallons and above gallons from \$6.18 to \$6.37 per 1,000 gallons. The Capital Project Improvement fee will go from \$8.50 to \$8.75 per month. This increase is due to the rising operation and maintenance costs, and saving for future water improvements. Stratford's Annual Pet Clinic

Due to the lack of past attendance the City Council had decided not to hold Stratford's Annual Pet Clinic this year. Last year there were only three animals served from inside Stratford City limits and only five animals in total. Please keep in mind the City of Stratford has an ordinance requiring all pets three month or older to be licensed within city limits. See full details below.

- Did you know that <u>every pet owner</u> that lives in the city limits of Stratford must license their pets (cat or dog) that is three (3) months or older?
- Before a license is issued, the owner shall provide a veterinarian's certificate from a licensed vet showing that the pet's rabies vaccination is up-to-date.
- The owner will receive a metal tag from the City of Stratford for the pet's collar. This is not just a benefit for the City, but to the owner as well. If an animal gets loose and is wearing a City of Stratford pet tag, the city will try to contact the owner before taking the pet to a holding facility.
- The City has no holding facility within city limits for strays that are picked up. If an animal is not licensed, the City may dispose of it in accordance with Iowa Code.
- This is important to avoid being non-compliant with Chapter 56 of Stratford Code of Ordinances which
 requires that all animals residing within city limits be licensed with the City. Non-compliancy can result in
 a municipal infraction which leads to a steep fine. It's easy to avoid!

- Pet licenses are issued at City Hall from 8 4:30 pm daily. The cost is \$5.00 per year starting June 1st and ending the last day of May of each year.



Please remember that when SNOW is in the air and on the ground there are a couple of City Ordinances that need to be followed.

135.12 DUMPING OF SNOW. It is unlawful for any person to throw, push, or place or cause to be thrown, pushed or placed, any ice or snow from private property, sidewalks, or driveways onto the traveled way of a street or alley so as to obstruct gutters, or impede the passage of vehicles upon the street or alley or to create a hazardous condition therein; except where, in the cleaning of large commercial drives in the business district it is absolutely necessary to move the snow onto the street or alley temporarily, such accumulation shall be removed promptly by the property owner or agent. Arrangements for the prompt removal of such accumulations shall be made prior to moving the snow.

(Code of Iowa, Sec. 364.12 [2])

69.11 SNOW REMOVAL. No person shall park, abandon or leave unattended any vehicle on any public street, alley, or City-owned off-street parking area during snow removal operations unless the snow has been removed or plowed from said street, alley or parking area and the snow has ceased to fall.

136.03 REMOVAL OF SNOW, ICE AND ACCUMULATIONS. It is the responsibility of the abutting property owners to remove snow, ice and accumulations promptly from sidewalks. If a property owner does not remove snow, ice or accumulations within 24 hours, the City may do so and assess the costs against the property owner for collection in the same manner as a property tax.

Notice to Stratford Residents:

HOUSING REHABILITATION ASSISTANCE AVAILABLE

The City of Stratford is accepting applications for their Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funded housing rehabilitation program. The objective of the program is the preservation of the City's housing stock through the rehabilitation of single-family home-ownership units located within the incorporated limits of the City of Stratford.

To apply, all of the following minimum requirements must be met:

- 1. The applicant must occupy the property to be assisted as their principal place of residence and must own the property (Ownership means holding Title to the property).
- 2. The applicant must have owned and resided in the property to be assisted at least six (6) months prior to the date of application for assistance and cannot be a under a contract sale.
- 3. The assisted property must be located within the targeted area as identified on map below.
- 4. The applicant must be current with regard to their mortgage payments, real estate taxes and utility payments associated with the property.
- 5. The assisted property must be hooked up to public water and sewer.
- 6. The assisted property must be covered by property insurance in an amount equal to or greater than the current assessed value of the property.
- 7. The assisted property must be free from garbage, debris, refuse, building materials, and abandoned non-operational or junk vehicles.
- 8. The household income must meet the program income guidelines listed below:
